Guideline 201.0 Alarms and Response



Purpose:

Responding to different types of emergencies requires a certain type of alarm and a certain number of fire apparatus to respond to these emergencies. This guideline establishes the type of alarms typically sounded and fire apparatus that are to respond to these emergencies.

Mercantile or Industrial, Hospital, Nursing Home or School:

City of Bryan-1st Engine, Tower, 2nd Engine, Rescue and 3rd Engine.

Rural- 1st Engine, Tanker, 2nd Engine, Rescue, Tower and 3rd Engine

Automobile Accident with Fire:

City of Bryan- Engine and Rescue.

Rural- Engine, Rescue and Tanker.

Automobile Accident (no entrapment) Calls:

Engine.

Automobile Accident With Entrapment Calls:

Rescue and Engine.

Automobile Fires:

Engine.

Grass Fires:

Truck 28 and Engine.

Note: May require additional equipment as determined by the size of fire.

Trash (Dumpsters)/Misc. Fires:

Engine.

Hazardous Material Spills, Leaks, Fires, etc.:

1st Engine, Haz Mat 1, Rescue, and 2nd Engine.

Mutual Aid- Haz Mat 1, Rescue, and Engine, also, the local fire department of that jurisdiction shall be dispatched.

Mutual Aid-

Equipment response and/or manpower as requested.

Automatic Mutual Aid-

Equipment response will be predetermined and responses will be as listed in the Automatic Mutual Aid books.
