#### A Letter from the Chief

As the seasons change, so does change come to the fire department. Beginning this month you will see a difference in the format for our monthly report. We began using a new vendor for our fire reporting software. Our previous vendor was bought out this past year and we began to see inconsistencies with our data. So we began the arduous task of finding a vendor to meet our needs. Emergency Reporting was the vendor that we settled on and we transferred to this new format beginning October 1.

As we changed to this new vendor, changes in the way that we input information had to change and changes in outputs occurred. While learning new tasks is never easy, we were able to overcome the hurdles from moving to this new vendor somewhat seamlessly. As we continue to learn our new software, you may see some other changes happen. Hopefully for the better.

I think you will find this new format more informative and easier to read than our previous version. One of the areas I think you will find most interesting is on the following page. The section on average turnout. We have always prided ourselves on our rapid ability to respond to calls for service. We had always said that our average response time was around three minutes but we could never glean that out of our previous software. Today we can and we were right - our firefighters are able to respond within 3 minutes. This is almost unheard of with a volunteer fire department. Nevertheless, our firefighters are the best that Northwest Ohio has to offer.

Enjoy the new format. As always, if you have any questions, please let us know.

Finally, I want to take a moment to ask you to take a few seconds out of our busy schedules each month and test our smoke detectors in our homes. To date there have been 78 fire deaths reported in the State of Ohio. Many of these deaths were due to no working smoke detectors in the home. While we have been blessed with no loss of life due to fire in our community, we still find many that we visit with who do not have a working smoke detector in their homes. Please, take a moment and check you detector. Does it work? If not does it need a new battery? Is your detector more than 10 years old? If so, replace it. The precious seconds that you have to escape from your home in case of a fire can be accomplished by having a working smoke detector. Please take time to check yours today. Every second counts.

As we come into the remaining months of 2019, it is our hope that you have a safe and joyous Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year.






