#### A Letter from the Chief

The number of calls for service are down for February, but number of building fires is above average. Last year 16 building fires occurred in the Bryan Fire service area. In just two months, we have had six fires.

The winter weather, cold and wind, has been a factor in those fires. Heating equipment has been a common source of ignition. Regular maintenance of installed equipment and care when using temporary heat sources is important to reduce the risk. Remember Carbon Monoxide is a colorless, odorless gas that displaces the oxygen in our cells. Temporary heater are susceptible to knock over by people and animals. When using space heaters make sure, there is adequate clearance from combustible material. Use heating devices with tip-over switches. Use care in placement of heaters to eliminate them from being accidently knock over and coming in contact with combustible materials.

Properly maintained smoke detectors can alert occupants of a fire. Fires occurring when occupants are sleeping are the most deadly. Test your smoke detectors at least monthly. If the detector is over 10 years old replace it. New detectors are available with sealed 10-year batteries.

Carbon monoxide is the result of incomplete combustion. Usually from a malfunctioning gas-fired hot water heater, furnace, stove, or clothes dryer. Please check all of your gas fired appliances and make sure that they are operating properly. Carbon monoxide is colorless and odorless. Install a carbon monoxide detector in your home to protect from this deadly gas.



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









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
